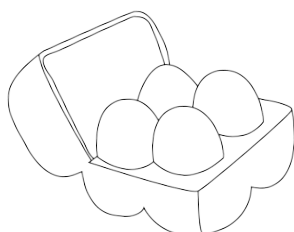

WHAT IS A COMMUNITY FRIDGE?

Community Fridges make surplus food freely available to local people. Food is donated by businesses or members of the public.

Community Fridges are open to everyone, regardless of means and are not food banks or a solution to food poverty.

A third of all food produced for humans globally goes to waste. The average UK household can save £60 a year by avoiding food waste. Community Fridges are a tried and tested way of reducing the environmental impact of food waste.



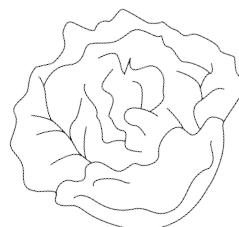
HOW DOES IT WORK?

Higher Blackley's Community Fridge is housed in a standalone unit just off the academy's main site - accessed through gate 5.



There is no need to register and there are no restrictions on the amount of food that can be taken from the Community Fridge. However, visitors should only take what they need and will use.

Personal hygiene items, including sanitary products, are also available.



HOW TO DONATE

Anyone can donate food to the Community Fridge.

There is a donation box in the main academy reception. Donations are also accepted at the Community Fridge (when it is open).
