It has been one of our school priorities to increase opportunities for educational visits. Our Rights Respecting School Award Council have been very busy this term. They planned a Super Learning Day of fun activities to help pupils understand their rights. They are helping us work towards reaccreditation of the gold level Rights Respecting School Award this year.




Family Support

Manchester Travel Training Partnership

Travel Training is designed to help young people with special needs to get more from life by giving them the skills and confidence to travel independently on public transport.

Travel Training helps to develop a range of practical and social skills in a hands-on setting by teaching young people how to get to and from school. It also prepares them for journeys they may make as they get older. These could include going to college, a work experience placement, employment, accessing health facilities, leisure opportunities and socialising.

Our Team of Specialist Travel Trainers work with young people to develop an individual package of support to teach skills which include:

- Road Safety
- -How to plan a journey
- -How to access buses and trams
- -Learning routes and landmarks
- -Being safe on transport
- -What to do in an emergency

Each route is risk assessed and all trainers are DBS checked and have received accredited Travel Training. We currently have 4 Travel Trainers working across Manchester.

The Manchester Travel Training Partnership can help any young person with special educational needs who travels to school on Home to School transport provided by Manchester City Council. If you feel your child may be ready to explore travel training please get in touch with our team at mttp@lancasterian.manchester.sch.uk or Speak to their school.








Class Etna






This term we have been learning about celebrations. We went to a party in Vesuvius and visited the Café. We looked at celebrations around the world and had fun with a parachute party in class.

This term class Everest have been working hard making Pakistani cakes and serving them in the café! We have welcomed lots of different classes to visit our café!












In English we have been learning all about science fiction. We created stop motion films to help tell our story!



Class Grasmoor have exploring lots of different shapes and their properties in Maths!






Class Helvellyn






Class Hunter

In humanities we learned about the British Monarchy. We had fun having our very Royal Banquet and tasting different foods. Everybody loved the strawberries and cream.








class Olympus

In Theme we have been exploring carnivals. We have taken part in our own parade and explored carnival music in the


music room.
